- 1. A famous design and fashion company has offered to fund a new school uniform for your school providing you supply details of the uniform, using coloured sketches, pencil drawings, paintings and where possible a practical 'mock-up'.**
- 2. This should be accompanied by a written explanation in the form of a diary, showing the development of your ideas.**

Things to keep in mind:

Your uniform might consist of:

A hat or cap

A tie, scarf or wrap

A shirt, blouse, t-shirt etc.

A jumper, sweatshirt, cardigan etc.

Trousers, skirt, dress, dungarees etc.

A jacket, overcoat etc.

Or you might like to focus your design into a particular area of the curriculum for example, sportswear for the P.E department, aprons and overalls for the Art, Science and Design Technology departments.

To complete this task work in a small group.

Consider the following:

Often artists and designers return to earlier periods and styles and rework these in different ways.

Think about the environment of your school.

Think about the community your school is situated in, are there cultural values that you would like symbolised in the design of your uniform.

Spend some time on 'thought showers' or research and discuss your ideas as a group.

Don't forget to delegate the work so that each member of the 'design team' is responsible for a different part of the uniform.

Remember that each member of the team must keep a diary explaining what they are doing and why.

Write your first diary entry explaining what you are responsible for and what you intend to do.
